Pre-school *	Term 4 has been very busy in preschool. Children enjoyed Sports day and are now preparing for the Christmas concert and Graduation. We are also doing transition visits to Preschool and to Reception. Children and families are equally excited about the upcoming events and enjoying the business of this term.
Reception *	It has been a busy term in the Reception Unit! We have been giving thanks for all that God has created and celebrating Jesus' birth at Christmas in our Religious Education lessons. We are continuing with developing our writing skills in Recount and Narrative genres in our English lessons and learning about Procedure writing too. In Mathematics we have been busy learning about Base 10, sorting 2D and 3D shapes, looking at collecting data and measuring by looking at activities we do on different days on the week. Our Integrated Inquiry is centred around developing an appreciation for how technology has changed in people's lives. We are learning about keeping ourselves safe and who we can trust in the Child Protection Curriculum. Sports Day was big highlight of our term and we certainly enjoyed not only the day, but the lead up and preparation too! We are very much looking forward to preparing for Christmas by completing craft activities and especially looking forward to our Christmas concert next week, show casing to our families all we have been learning about in our specialist music lessons. It has been a wonderful year of learning together and watching the children grow and develop in their first year of Primary School.
Year 1 *	We have had a fantastic Term 4 so far in Year One! In Week 4, we had our excursion to the Adelaide Zoo where we learnt about different animals and their habitats. In Literacy, we wrote our own information reports about our chosen animals.  We celebrated our final Year One Mass where we reflected upon our wonderful year of learning. In Religion, we wrote our own prayers praising the world around us and shared how we can care for God's wonderful creation.  We are looking forward to our school's Christmas Carols next week, where we will be singing and performing the song, 'Candy Cane Lane' by Sia.
Year 2 *	The Year Two's have had a wonderful term so far.  Early in the term we celebrated our last mass together, giving thanks for the year.  In Literacy, we have been learning to write persuasive texts and in Mathematics we have learnt about multiplication, division and now we are focusing on money. In Technology and Design lessons we created our own floating toys and then we tested them out! We have recreated some art works by Sidney Nolan and Ken Done.  We are now looking forward to our excursion to see 'A Boy Called Christmas.'

Year 3 *	The year 3 students have had a successful year, exploring, creating and inquiring.  They have become independent learners, working together and are now ready to become year 4 student in 2022. The students enjoyed Sports Day last Friday and are looking forward to swimming week. They are also looking forward to the Year 3 excursion to the movies to watch "A Boy Called Christmas". Some of the Year 3 students celebrated their a Sacrament of Reconciliation this term, this was a special occasion for the students and their families.  During the term, the student enjoyed reading "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory". Learning about the sun and moon in Science and using a IT program called "Scratch" to show phases of the moon in STEM. They have drawn and created 2D and 3D shapes, learnt about volume, Mass and capacity in Maths. The student have written explanations about the skeletal system and the digestive system. In Art, the student will be exploring the art work of Cathy Baxter and Indigenous Artist Sally Morgan. In Religion the students have learnt about the Nativity story and are looking forward to creating some Christmas crafts.
Year 4 *	The year 4 students have been investigating shapes and angles in Mathematics and have just embarked upon a Probability, Chance and Data Unit. During HASS we have combined our English Information Report writing with our research projects on Endangered Animals. Our Class Mass was a big success as children took part, reading, singing, and praying reverently. During Religious Education lessons, we are exploring how God is revealed through the life, death and resurrections of Jesus. Design and Technology lessons have been a hit, students excited to build their rafts and test if they float. We all enjoyed Sports Day and are looking forward to our excursion to the Museum and Art Gallery.
Year 5 *	This term has been a whirlwind of events! We enjoyed not only participating in Sports Day last week, but certainly enjoyed the practicing of activities in our specialist sports lessons and cheers practices each week. We discussed leadership qualities and took note as we are the future sports captains next year! We have been equally as busy in our specialist music lessons preparing and learning songs for the Christmas concert next week too. In Religious Education this term, we have been busy preparing our hearts and minds for Advent and the birth of Jesus. We have also been learning about the seven Sacraments and how we encounter God in our daily lives through these sacraments. English lessons have continued to be a big focus on strengthening our researching skills, looking also at comprehension and inferencing skills. We have incorporated Report writing into our Hass topics in Geography and Business and Economics. In Mathematics we have been focussing on telling the time and collecting data then representing it on graphs. It has been wonderful watching the children grow throughout the year and we look forward to seeing them thrive as leaders of our school next year.

including their excursion to the Beach House, their retreat and of course their graduation ceremony and dinner. We all look forward to enjoying the final few weeks here at Payneham and making the most of our time here as a collective unit.

## STEM - \* Nicholas Polvere

STEM has continued to challenge the children's creativity and building their Digital Technology/Media skills. They have all demonstrated an excellent willingness to face challenges with enthusiasm and collaboration with their peers. Receptions have learnt about ways to measure in creative, but accurate methods. Year 1s have been engaged in learning about design for animal enclosures and their survival needs. This has extended to Augmented Reality creation of the enclosure design. Year 2s have been explaining forces through animation tasks. Year 3s have also been learning about using animation to demonstrate knowledge about the various phases of the moon. Stop animation has been the focus for the Year 4 classes. Year 5s have designed a flood proof home for the people in Bangladesh. Our graduates (Year 6s) have designed a 3D trinket that represents their experiences at St Joseph's, Payneham.
