AWARD CATEGORIES Open to pre-school, early learner centre (ELC), primary, secondary **EARLY CAREER** and CEO education advisors with no more than five years of teaching **TEACHER** experience. Open to experienced pre-school, early learner centre (ELC), primary, **EXPERIENCED** secondary and CEO education advisors with six or more years of **TEACHER** teaching experience. Open to staff who deliver administration and support functions including **EDUCATION** business and finance staff, support staff working in administration, special **SUPPORT** needs, ICT, library and grounds and maintenance staff. Open to any individual who has made a significant contribution in a **VOLUNTEER** voluntary capacity over a significant period of time. **INNOVATIVE** Open to a program or coordinated approach to an educational need or problem with an emphasis on innovative thinking, planning and action. **PROGRAM** LEADERSHIP / Open to those who have provided a long and sustained significant LIFELONG contribution to excellence in Catholic education. CONTRIBUTION Open to individuals or group initiatives who are committed to the LAUDATO SI principles of Laudato Si through ecological conversion, eco-spirituality, social justice action and advocacy. RELIGIOUS Open to teachers of Religious Education, including leaders who are **EDUCATION** teaching in this learning area, who inspire students in their religious self-understanding and spirtual awareness.
