The Seesaw app. will be used for sharing your child's schoolwork, as well as a communication tool. If details have not been shared already, information will be coming home soon from class teachers.

Building work update

Over the holiday period, work on the two-level, eight classroom (with added facilities and amenities) structure has continued. It is exciting to see the development that has taken place.

COVID-19 Update and Volunteering

We all have a part to play in keeping our school community safe and minimising the disruption to learning that can occur when illness circulates at school.

Therefore, students/staff who are unwell should stay home if they have cold or flu-like symptoms and get tested for COVID-19. If students/staff have COVID-19, please advise the school as soon as possible, and stay at home until all acute symptoms (runny nose, sore throat, cough and fever) have cleared.

Further, as highlighted late last year, there is an update and change in relation to the COVID-19 Vaccination Policy as implemented by Catholic Education South Australia (CESA). The amended Policy has adopted a 'personal responsibility' approach that strongly encourages vaccination, but does not require it to work and volunteer in most CESA workplace settings (except a few 'high-risk' settings where up-to-date vaccination will be required).

This outcome means that volunteers who are approved by the school to provide support at St Joseph's Payneham, including attending excursions, now need only to comply with the South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools (SACCS) Policy for Volunteers. In short, volunteers need to have signed the school's Volunteer Declaration and hold a current Catholic Working With Children Check. Ongoing volunteers also need to have completed the free 2 hour online Mandatory Reporting (RRHAN-EC) training.

We are grateful for your continued support of our students, particularly in volunteering for different events and activities.

Parking, road safety, driver etiquette and being friendly to our neighbours

School drop-off and pick-up times are busy for everyone. The aim is for this to happen in a safe and courteous manner. Please demonstrate consideration and patience, as well as travelling slowly around the school, especially where marked (no faster than 25 km/h).

As a result of the busyness at drop-off and pick-up, finding a car park next to the school gate can be tricky. An idea could be to find a park a little further away from the school, where you will not only find it easier to locate a parking space, but also opportunity for some exercise with your child/ren, and an extra chance to 'connect', as you walk your child to and from school. You could even plan to meet with another family at a designated point, and then walk the 5-10 minutes.

Moreover, please be considerate of our neighbours, which includes not parking or standing with your vehicle in their driveways. Lastly, kindly ensure your child(ren) are keeping out of residents' gardens. Thank you for your anticipated attention to the above.

Supervision

For children who arrive at school before 8:30am, they will need to go to Before School Care, as there is no supervision in the yard until this time. Likewise, after school, any child who is not collected from 3:25pm, will be taken to After School Care. Also, if your child is being collected early from school, they need to be signed-out at the Front Office.

Supervision at After School Sports Training and Clinics

A reminder that any siblings of children attending after-school sports trainings or clinics, need to be supervised by yourselves (or a caregiver i.e., a grandparent). If this is not possible, please ensure any children not directly involved in the after-school training or clinic are booked into OSHC. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation.

School Uniform News

The students are looking very neat and professional in their uniforms. Wearing the correct uniform brings a great sense of belonging to the community as well as pride in one's appearance. Let's work together to ensure it is sustained. A reminder, students are to wear their school hats during Term One and from 1 September. Wearing the sport uniform is only to occur on the allocated days.

Additionally, from 2024 St Joseph's Payneham will be endorsing a new school uniform. The Uniform Committee, together with the School Board have been working through this process during 2022. There will of course be a transition period from the current uniform to the

Nut allergies

St Joseph's Payneham tries very hard to create a 'nut free' environment. There are a number of students across the various year levels in our school who will suffer an extreme adverse reaction — life threatening in some cases – if they come into contact with any food product containing the slightest trace of nut substance! For that reason, we ask parents/caregivers to avoid sending nut products to school. When classes have 'shared lunches', parents will need to be mindful that the plate of food that is being sent to school is 'nut free'. We appreciate this could be an inconvenience as some children love peanut paste, Nutella and other nut-based spreads. This inconvenience though is nothing compared to the extreme consequences that may result, and we therefore ask for your understanding.

Food allergies

Incidentally, in a typical classroom at least one student is likely to be affected by food allergies, and the number of children with food allergies is increasing. A food allergy is an adverse immune system reaction that occurs soon after exposure to a certain food. As children get older, allergen avoidance becomes complex as they desire to fit in with peers and navigate social activities. Therefore, the rest of the school community needs to be vigilant, to ensure that all children are not placed in awkward situations whereby they may experience a severe reaction. For that reason, we discourage students sharing food and touching other people's food.

Head injuries at school

Our school's current procedure for managing 'minor' student head injuries i.e., ball impact to the head, bumping into another object, etc., is for students to be assessed by a Senior First Aider in the Front Office. If students are identified to be well enough to continue their day at school, the child's 'first emergency contact' is telephoned to alert that a minor head injury has taken place.

Newsletter format in 2023

Lastly, the Parent Newsletter will be circulated three times a term this year – in Weeks 1, 5 and 9. Other relevant messages will of course be communicated as required.

Child Proctection

Child protection and safety is extremely important at St Joseph's. We have a focus on relationships and social and emotional learning at the beginning of our new year. Returning to school, for all of us after our holiday break, means returning to routine, stability, consistency. For all of our students returning to school should mean that they are returning to a safe place where they matter, they thrive, and they are nurtured. As well as our social and emotional learning focus, all students will be engaged in the Child Protection curriculum, taught in all classes throughout the year, learning about strategies to keep themselves well and safe.

Walking Home

If your child/ren are going to walk home from school this year, please discuss the responsibilities associated with walking home with them and complete the **Walking Home Permission form.** This not only helps to educate your child about appropriate behaviour when walking without an adult, but also gives the school a list of walkers to help us track the students at pick up time. Remember walking home permission means the child/ren walks home from school to home and does not include walking to a side street or Tarcoma Avenue so that you can pick them up from there.

Each child will be given a Permission Card which they can show the teacher on duty indicating parents have signed a permission form.

Bring Your Own iPad

Bringing technology into the classroom is the best way to provide a 21st century learning environment. Devices are increasingly being incorporated at St Joseph's because they boost students' capabilities of learning anytime, and anywhere. Online access in classrooms significantly broadens the scope of the learning experience allowing for creative thinking, communication, and collaboration

When your child enters Year 3, they will be using a device in their daily learning for tasks involving research, creativity, word processing, comprehension, coding and much more. BYOD Program helps to promote positive digital citizenship for all students. When thinking ahead for your child's future school years, please note that all high schools in the Eastern region have implemented a 'Bring Your Own iPad' for Year 7 and beyond.

Student Participation Agreement:

All parents and students are required to sign the student agreement. Please ensure the agreement is explained and discussed with your child. Then sign both forms and return to their classroom teacher.

Your child will not be disadvantaged in the classroom if they do not own an iPad. However, the iPad will be an effective tool to assist your child with a wide scope of learning opportunities. Students without iPads will have access to a school owned iPad with other peers (one

between two students), but it will be beneficial for students to bring their own iPad as it can be tailored to their needs. Borrowed iPads remain at school at all times.

School Wi-Fi:

Our ICT Support person, Barbara Cole will connect the BYOD iPads to the school Wi-Fi and install a c-filter, which will monitor all devices connected to our network.

Classroom Use:

The amount of time that students will spend on their iPad each day will vary from year level to year level, class to class, student to student and even day to day. Students will participate in a balance between iPad tasks and pencil/paper tasks. It is the responsibility of the student to bring a charged iPad each day.

Please note: We want to be very clear that we view the BYOD program as another tool for learning. It will not replace pen and paper, nor will it replace quality teaching. These devices provide fast and easy access to information and enable students to explore concepts more independently, to explain their thinking, to create presentations and other multimedia products and to share their learning and understandings.

We hope you share in our excitement about the BYOD program as a way of ensuring we are meeting our obligations to our students in preparing them with the digital literacies they require.
