St Joseph's Payneham, celebrating 60 years

As has been emphasised previously, this year is our school's 60th Anniversary. Next Friday 5 August, is a whole school Mass (at 10:00am), celebrating the feast of St Mary MacKillop, and also recognising our 60-year history. During recess, there will be a treat for the children and extended play time.

Building and Infrastructure update

The Stage 1 building work will be commencing in the near future. As mentioned previously, this will be a two-level, eight classroom structure with added facilities (on the eastern side of the school).

The new STEM Room (located on 11 Marian Road) has been completed and is being used as a specialist classroom this term.

There are three containers located on 11 Marian Road. These are temporary pods which contain parish gear from their existing sheds. Once new parish sheds are constructed, the equipment will be transported into the new sheds and the pods removed.

You may have noticed the property on the corner of Tarcoma Avenue and Portrush Road has been demolished. As has been cited before, this space will be made into a staff and visitor car park.

Feast of St Mary of the Cross

Who is this remarkable woman who has inspired so many to pray through her intercession for their needs?

Mary MacKillop was an Australian who co-founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart in 1866. The Order grew because it was needed. There were 750 Sisters in the Order when she died. Even in her dying she was deemed to be a saint. Today there are over a thousand Sisters, who live the charism of Mary MacKillop, to do the will of God with love and gratitude, in their day to day lives.

St Mary MacKillop certainly knew tough times. Julian Tenison Woods described Mary's life as 'a nest of crosses' and yet she never lost her faith and her hope that everything would turn out okay.



St Mary Mackillop was a prolific writer and there is so much wisdom in her words; wisdom for all time.

She wrote in 1890 "Keep your mind in peace whatever happens"

What can we take from Mary MacKillop's wisdom for these unpredictable times we find ourselves in?

Mary MacKillop reminds us to slow down in our minds and be in peace there. If only we could keep our mind in peace we would not miss the ordinary. Slowing down offers the opportunity to take in more of the 'ordinary' things in our lives, that in busyness we can overlook. The ordinary has so much to offer if we are in tune and have a feeling for what is going on around us.

St Mary MacKillop was always aware of the presence of God hidden in the ordinary things of life. She knew that she was called to bear her cross.

Mary MacKillop lived by the power of the Cross, in the light of resurrection. She carried her cross without complaint, as a gift from God. She never shirked hardship because she saw it as Christ asking her to do something for him.

Mary MacKillop died on 8th August 1909 in the Josephite convent in North Sydney. She was beatified in 1995 and was canonised on 17th October 2010. This year marks the 10th Anniversary of her Canonisation.

Ever generous God,

You inspired Saint Mary MacKillop to live her life faithful to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and constant in bringing hope and encouragement to those who were disheartened, lonely or needy. With confidence in your generous providence and joining with Saint Mary MacKillop we ask that you grant our request.

Feast of the Assumption

On 15th August as Catholics, we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, when we remember that Mary was taken or 'assumed' into Heaven after she died. This was God's way of showing us that Mary is special to God, she said 'yes' to becoming the Mother of Jesus.

The Assumption Mass will be celebrated at school on Monday 15th August led by Year 5s, which will be in the Church at 9:15am.

You can log into the Accessit Library from inside the library, from the classroom and even from home. Anywhere you have a computer, tablet or phone that is connected to the internet.

Most students will log on as a Guest. This enables the user to search for books held in our library and keep up to date with what is happening in the library and more.

Students in years 4 to 6 will be given a username and password. This will enable them to reserve books, write reviews, check their borrowing details and much more.

A separate notice will be issued to the year 4 to 6 students, shortly with their log on details.
