Sacraments of Initiation

The Sacraments of First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Holy Communion are celebrated annually within our Parish.

The program commences in Term 3 of the school year with the preparation for the Sacrament of First Reconciliation. Normally the children celebrating their First Reconciliation are in Year 3, however as with each of these Sacraments any school age children can participate.

The following year when the children are in Year 4, they are then prepared for the Sacrament of Confirmation, which is usually celebrated by the Archbishop. Following their Confirmation, the children are then prepared for their First Holy Communion.

Preparation for each Sacrament normally involves both parents and children attending a series of Information nights and practices. These are compulsory to attend.

Our first meeting for the Sacrament of Reconciliation was held on **Tuesday 20th September.** It was an important night for parents as Father Michael spoke about the importance of this Sacrament and why the children are celebrating it. We also talked about the essential role that parents play in preparing their children for Reconciliation. Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday, **9th November at 6:00pm where the students will join the parents for a Reconciliation Workshop.**

ReLAT - Religious Education Literacy Assessment Tool (for Year 4s)

Religious Education (RE) is a core Learning Area in all Catholic Schools. It is a foundation for all learning and is integrated into the life of the school through prayer, liturgy and social justice programs.

ReLAT will be based on general religious knowledge gained from participation in RE lessons using the New Crossways Program and the religious dimension of the Catholic School. Please note that the assessment is not a measure of a child's faith nor their participation in the broader life of the Catholic community. It is important to draw upon a variety of assessment strategies in order to develop a comprehensive picture of a child's progress and understanding in Religious Education.

The ReLAT assessment tool is an online multiple-choice test with 35 questions. Children are given up to an hour to complete the test. If your child usually receives some form of adjustment for their learning needs, that same assistance will be available to them in this assessment.

The data from the ReLAT assessment will be collated and used by the school to inform whole-of-school professional learning needs and the continuous improvement of teaching in Religious Education. Individual results will be made available to your child's teacher. An individual ReLAT report for parents will be provided to you, to complement the school report. As always, you are welcome to discuss your child's learning in Religious Education with the class teacher.

Classroom Prayer

Prayer is at the heart of our Christian spirituality and an opportunity for us to be aware of the presence of God in our everyday life. This sacred time also provides the opportunity for children to be in dialogue with our Catholic Tradition and seek truth and interpretation by asking questions and sharing ideas and experiences. I have been present during Prayer in classes and it has been a true gift to hear the awe and wonder of our learners as they seek meaning.

Catholic Charities Appeal

"Never see a need without doing something about it" was one of the sayings of St Mary MacKillop and is what drives our Catholic Charity work in assisting struggling families and individuals in our own community.

In Week 2 your child would have bought home a Catholic Charity Booklet which outlined some of the essential works of our charitable agencies. Some include Centacare Domestic Violence and Homelessness Services to name but a few.

Over the next few weeks, the students in all classes will be provided the opportunity to get involved in fundraising to support the homeless living in our society.

Being part of the Josephite Tradition means we are a welcoming, inclusive, compassionate community. Mary MacKillop believed that the compassionate love of God was available to all she met. Mary Mackillop had a compassionate heart for everyone.

During this time in our school community, we do the same. We promote compassion and empathy amongst our children for those less fortunate.
